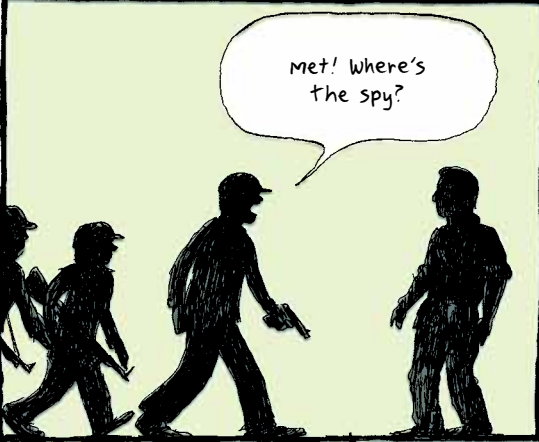

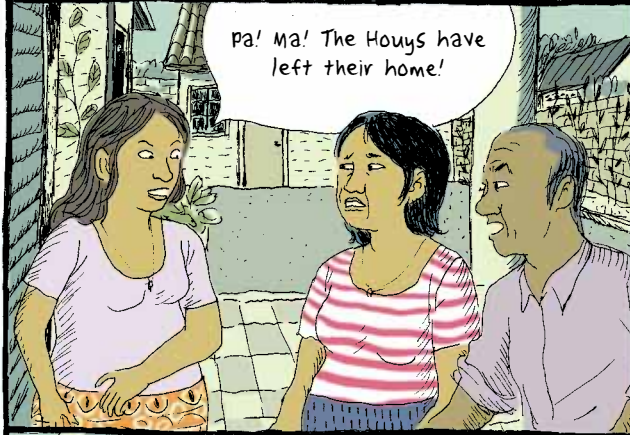

What are we going to do, Pa?

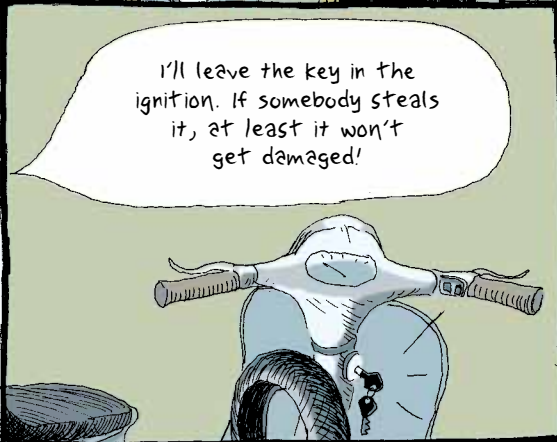
We'll wait for Khim to get back.

But we'll start packing. You never know...





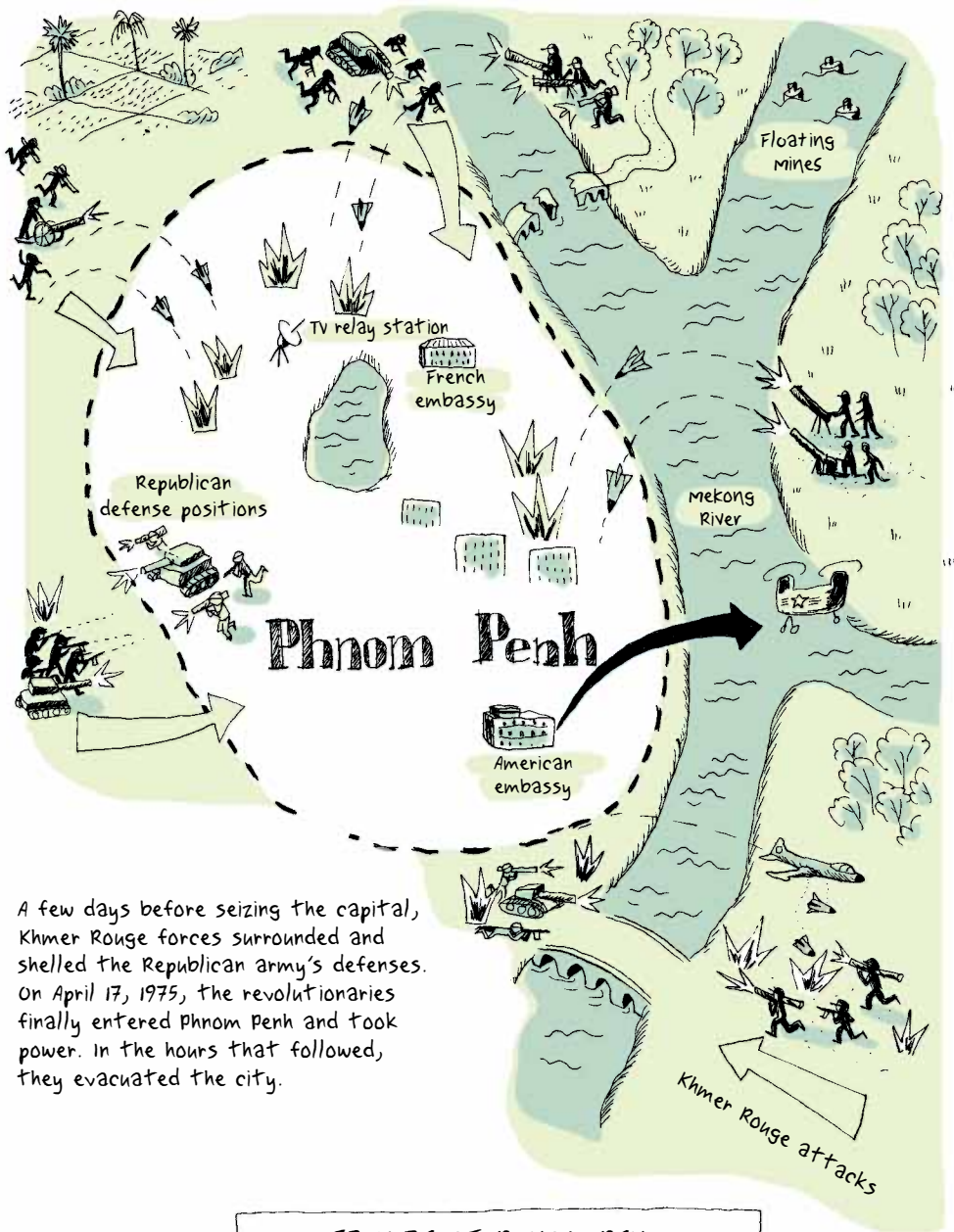
